DUCKS IN YOUR POOL? DON'T HURT 'EM, SQUIRT 'EM!



During a recent conversation with a neighbor, I heard a slight *tsk-tsk-tsk* in the background. I ignored it. Several minutes later, there it was once again. What was that, I wondered? I found that it may have been the answer to a common neighborhood question: *How can we humanely keep ducks out of and herons from building nests over our swimming pools?*

Based on what I learned that day, I believe that in some cases, the right answer may be a "scarecrow sprinkler." These devices are commonly used to keep critters away from vegetable and flower gardens. They rely on motion-activated technology to detect nuisance animals and, once detected, they shoot a stream of water in the animal's direction. According to many users, this is effective in scaring off and discouraging a variety of animals from returning, including ducks and other large birds.

I believe we have a large contingent of animal lovers in Dana Shores. Having grown up on a farm and being the daughter of an equine veterinarian, I love animals. Still, I don't believe they belong in or over swimming pools (except for Labradors and other water-loving dogs, of course).

The neighbor I spoke with uses the Orbit Yard Enforcer. He had it connected to a hose (I believe he used an air compression hose with the filter removed) and was happy with its ability to keep birds off his overhead structure.

A variety of motion-activated sprinklers exist on the market. Most cost under \$100. We found an interesting write-up on www.wiki.ezvid.com comparing several products. We also found that different manufacturers use different types of motion-detection technology. Some use passive infrared sensors to measure changes in heat, others measure ultrasonic vibrations to detect movement. Consider falling leaves and other movement in your yard, the average temperature of the area (vs. body heat), the size of the area, and other factors to determine if one of these might be right for your home. Also remember to have a plan so that you, your pets, and especially your neighbors can still enjoy your yards without any wet surprises!

HALLOWEEN PARTIES FOR ALL AGES!

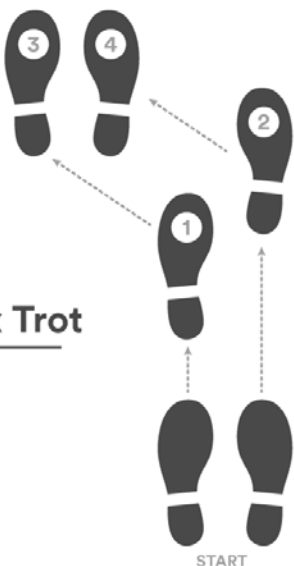

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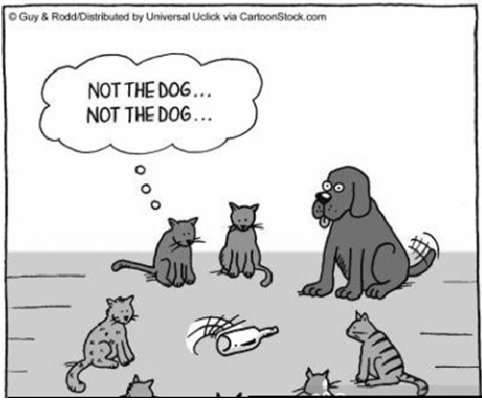
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NEIGHBORHOOD VOLUNTEERS: MAKING A BETTER LIFE FOR PETS

If you've ever met Doctors Janet Marley and Eli Rose (E Eden Roc Circle), you know they have a love for animals, community, and giving back. Now that they are retired, they have directed some of their passion toward pet welfare, volunteering each week at the Animal Coalition of Tampa (ACT).

ACT is a 501(c)(3) non-profit whose mission is to improve animal welfare through spay/neuter programs, affordable veterinary care, and comprehensive education. This low-cost clinic has spayed or neutered over 100,000 animals and has provided vital medical care to countless family pets.

HAVE BACKPACK? WONDER WHY?

We're commonly asked for advice on what constitutes "suspicious activity." When should a neighbor call the sheriff's department to report someone? Today's news climate can cause all of us to second guess whether to call. We know, however, that criminals come in all sizes, shapes, ages, and colors. The key is to focus on behavior.

The Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) suggests we not let anything hinder us from reporting behaviors that seem outside of the norm:

- A stranger walking through the neighborhood with a backpack on.
- A person running from a residence or vehicle for no apparent reason.
- A person with seemingly no purpose, wandering around the neighborhood.
- A person going from door to door.
- A vehicle idling slowly without any lights on at night.
- And so on.

We have a more comprehensive list of suspicious behaviors on the residents-only portion of our website, but your best resources will probably be your gut. If you have that bad feeling in the pit of your stomach, please call the HCSO non-emergency number immediately. The most basic element of our crime-free vision requires stopping crime before it happens.

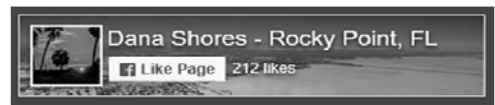
JOIN US ON FACEBOOK – WE HAVE TWO NEIGHBORHOOD PAGES

LAST CALL

I remember growing up hearing my parents talk about what they were doing and where they were the moment they heard President Kennedy had been shot. I believe our generation's defining moment occurred when we heard the twin towers had fallen. Many of us watched the horror unfold on our televisions. Our souls wept as we watched families posting pictures of loved ones across New York, hoping beyond hope that they would return.

One man who now calls Dana Shores home expressed his grief through words. Waking up in the middle of the night after hearing the rescue mission had been changed to a recovery mission, he explains that it felt like someone else was moving his hand across the page. With every scratch of the pen, he found a way to express his sorrow and turn toward hope.

He shared his poem with some friends and family shortly thereafter, and they shared it with their friends and family. Before long, the poem had made its way to families of victims who read it at their memorial services, to churches, and to a familiar book publisher. Today, you'll find the poem published in *Chicken Soup for the Soul of America* and recorded as a song.

I would like to personally thank Dave Timmons, resident of Versailles Drive, for also allowing us to share his poem of loss and newfound hope with you in our newsletter.

*As smoke and heat diminished from the mangled steel and glass,
The hope of rescue workers faded in and out so fast.
These heroes of our nation working tirelessly to find
A sound, a breath, some proof of life, to keep that hope alive.*

*The victims were so innocent, just doing their life's work,
In a nation called America, the most free on this Earth.
Suddenly, a worker finds a cell phone flashing red.
He plays the "last call" message, and this is what it said:*

*"Hello, it's me. I'm calling to tell you I'm all right.
I've made it up to heaven; I tried to call last night.
The group that I arrived with is strong and brave and tall,
And proud to be Americans while answering God's call.*

*I love you all and know I've been in all your thoughts and prayers.
You need to know I felt no pain and safely made it here.
Now let me say a prayer for you of closure and of life,
Move on with courage and with faith that we will reunite.*

*I know it's sad; I'll age no more, but in this you can trust.
My dreams were put back on the Earth in particles of dust.
That dust is in the air you breathe; I've passed it on to you.
So please breathe deeply every day and make my dreams come true."*

SHRINER'S PROPERTY ON DANA SHORES DRIVE SOLD

After a year of negotiation, the large waterfront parcel that has been home to A' La Carte and the Shriners was sold in August 2017 for \$10.5 million. Taylor Morrison, a local upscale builder, plans to develop the property into a mix of townhomes and million-dollar-plus, waterfront single-family homes.

They envision townhomes similar to those built at the Cove at Loggerhead Marina in St. Petersburg and single-family homes similar to those built in Ladera, a recently sold-out community in Lutz.

Taylor Morrison set the maximum project density to eighty-four residences (sixty town homes and twenty-four single-family homes). Earlier this year, they obtained zoning approval from the county, allowing them to build to a lower density than local zoning would otherwise call for. We believe the combination of lower density and upscale development will be another positive for property values in Dana Shores, Pelican Island, and Sweetwater.

The Shriner's local chapter is seeking a new location, and A' La Carte will fulfill its event obligations through the end of this year. Taylor Morrison plans to kick off their construction efforts in February 2018.

On a related and very exciting note, Taylor Morrison has adjusted their project budget to incorporate undergrounding! After working closely with our civic association board, they agreed to bury the utilities along Dana Shores Drive that run along their property's east perimeter. This project was not contemplated in the initial plans for the new development. Taylor Morrison's choice to partner with us will help our project achieve an even bigger impact, and their support demonstrates that we share a common vision for improving the area. (Watch - upcoming newsletters for additional details on our undergrounding project. We're making great progress toward the finish line!)

228 DERELICT CRAB TRAPS REMOVED FROM TAMPA BAY

60 SECOND UPDATE

Improvements for Bicycle Riders:

Some time ago, we worked with the county to begin locking the service gates to Skyway Park again. It has significantly reduced the number of cars passing by neighbors' homes, and reducing the park to a single means of ingress and egress at night has significantly cut down on loitering and other inappropriate after-hour behaviors.



Still, not everything was smooth sailing. Doug Longfellow (Doral Drive) reached out, letting us know that the closed gates were causing issues for bicyclists, particularly after heavy rains. We have been working with the county on this and were recently told that work will be done soon to accommodate this issue. Thanks, Doug, for giving us the heads up!

Other Improvements around Skyway Park:

Have you noticed that the dilapidated fencing that once ran from the corner of George and Independence east to the Veteran's has been replaced? The civic association has been working diligently with Hillsborough County Parks and Recreation to enhance this area one step at a time. We hope you are enjoying the new look, feel, and enhanced safety of our park!

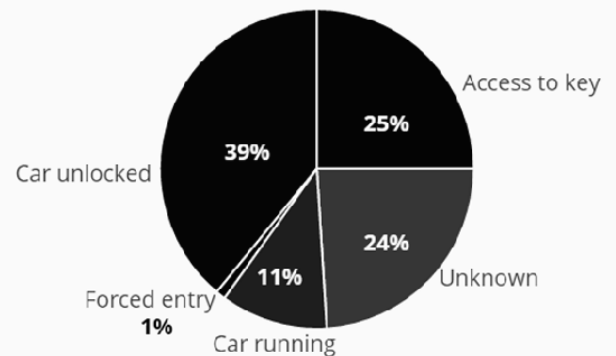


UPDATE -- GROWING EPIDEMIC: YOUNG CHILDREN STEALING CARS

The *Shore Lines* June edition had an article written by Holly Simmons about a growing epidemic: children as young as ten years old stealing vehicles with reckless abandon, running lights, and barreling down roadways at +100 MPH (often in the wrong direction) while holding up their phones to record videos as proof for their friends. In 2015, Pinellas police made 499 felony arrests for juvenile auto theft, more than any other Florida county going back 8 years and more than the most populous counties in the US, including LA.

How kids get the cars

Of more than 500 cars stolen by kids in Pinellas County between January 2015 and June 2016, in cases in which the method of theft is known, a majority was left unlocked.



The article also listed the three things our residents can do to protect not only our cars but also innocent drivers on the roadways. When possible, park cars in garages with the garage door shut. Otherwise, lock your car doors every time you leave your vehicle unattended. Check your glove box, the owner's manual, and other compartments for any spare keys and remove them along with any weapons from your vehicle.

We received numerous comments about the story. Many residents went back and read the full-length Tampa Bay Times article, which can be found by googling *Hot Wheels Investigation*.
